Science Thinking: Plants, Perfumes and Power..

What do these all have in common?

These are all topics that our Year 12 classes have been exploring in Ms van Maanen's Biology, Chemistry, and Physics classes, making excellent use of the new Science Laboratories.

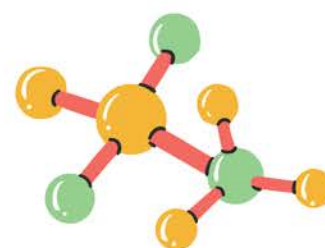
In Biology, our Year 12 students spent several weeks investigating the factors that affect the rates of photosynthesis and cellular respiration. They each designed and completed their own experiments using a wide range of equipment available in our new laboratory. Our biology students should be very proud of the final reports they submitted as part of this assessment.



In Chemistry, students have been experimenting with hydrocarbons and the various reactions that can produce useful compounds. Our budding chemists were busy last week creating aromas (esters)—some lovely, and according to the class down the corridor, some not so pleasant.



In Physics, students put their problem-solving skills to the test, determining the most effective way to generate power using solar panels in series or parallel configurations. They also constructed a step-up transformer to explore the relationship between voltage, current, and power losses.

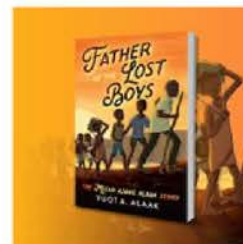


Father of the Lost Boys by Yuot A. Alaak 2024

He has tried to fly under the radar, has only one friend and a relentless bully who targets his obvious lack of money and a future.

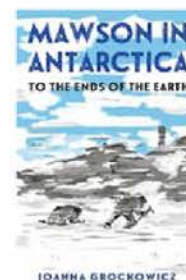
