The following information is provided to outline arrangements for some important upcoming events.

Headstart Commences

The College will commence the Headstart program this Wednesday, 27th of November. Students of all year levels will commence the curriculum in their new classes for 2025. To make this as effective as possible, we would appreciate the support of parents and carers to ensure students have necessary book listed and stationary items so they have all the resources required. Students considering subject changes may do so through their relevant YLL prior to the 12th December.

College Mass and Awards Ceremony

The end of year College Mass will be held on Thursday, 12th December at 10.00 am in the Multi-Purpose Building. All families are invited to celebrate with us. An awards ceremony will follow the celebration of the Eucharist. To assist in making the necessary arrangements for work and care, families whose child is to receive an award will be notified in advance.

Student Attendance

The last day of attendance for Year 7 – 11 students is Thursday, 12th December. Students are expected to be in attendance up to and including this date.

End of Year Dance

The End of Year Dance Celebration will be held in the Multi-Purpose Building from 6.00 – 9.00 pm on Thursday, 12th December. The celebration will involve students from Years 7 – 11 in traditional style partner and progressive 'Ballroom Dancing' as well as some modern dance styles. Students will have scheduled practices over the next 2 weeks. A whole school practice will be held after the End of Year Mass.

Dress Code: The event does not require the wearing of formal attire. However, students have been reminded that they should wear attire that is both smart and neat clothes that they would wear to a significant family celebration. The following recommendations are provided to assist families in the selection of appropriate clothing.

No thongs, runners, denim, jeans, t-shirts or singlet style tops.

Neat shoes, dress shorts or trousers and a button through collared shirt. Jackets and ties are optional. Outfits should be appropriate to the etiquette of the occasion in relation to length and modesty.

Attendance: Attendance at school, the College Mass and dance practice on the 12th December is a prerequisite for attending the Dance. Tickets will be provided to students at school on the day. Students will not be admitted without a ticket. Students will be dismissed from school at 1.30 pm. Supervision will be provided for those students who need to remain at school until the end of the school day.

Dropping Off and Picking Up: Students are not permitted to make their own way to or from the event. As it is a school function, Year 11 students are not permitted to drive other students, with the exception of family members, to or from the event.

Students can be dropped off at the main gate to the Multi-Purpose Building from 5:45 pm and can be picked up following the conclusion of the dance at 9:00 pm. Students will only be allowed to leave in the company of a parent or other nominated adult.

Wellbeing


The Brave Program is a FREE online program for teenagers and their parents. The program is self-paced so you can work through it as you need.

Stepping Sideways: Worlds of steampunk & dystopia Edited by Mily Larkin 2024

Thirteen Australian authors have written short stories based in Steampunk or Dystopian worlds. From stories about a despotic circus boss who mistreats his workers to a group of kids escaping scavenger dogs in a brutal world.

Evenfall – The Golden Linnet by Alexander Armstrong 2024

Sam is about to turn thirteen and has lived a fairly ordinary life. His mum died in an accident five years ago and his dad has been slowly fading away ever since. As his birthday looms strange things start happening and Sam discovers he has special abilities – and bad people seem to be after him.

The Glass Girl by Kathleen GlasGow 2024

Fifeteen year old Bella doesn't believe that she has a problem, but slowly her life is falling apart. It started with the death of her grandmother, and her parents constant fighting and separation. They were the triggers, and alcohol became the solution. A compelling story of teenage addiction.



Heir by Sabaa Tahir 2024

This is the first book in a new fantasy series, in the young adult category.

It is the story of three young people who are all fighting their own demons and the injustices that have happened to all of them in the past. The story is told from each of our main characters' points of view. Aiz, and orphan who wants revenge; Sirsha, banished and bunting a child killer; and Quil, the reluctant heir to the empire.
