SACRED HEART COLLEGE SCHOOL UNIFORM

PLEASE NOTE, upcoming change regarding our school uniform policy.

After careful consideration and feedback from both staff and parents, we have decided to implement a 12-month transitional period to support families in adjusting to the new uniform requirements.

During this period, students will be permitted to wear either the current or new uniform, ensuring a smooth and flexible transition. We understand that uniform changes may require time for families to make necessary purchases, and this extended period is intended to alleviate any inconvenience.

Key Details:

The 12-month transition will begin FEB 2025 and all students will be expected to be fully in compliance with the new uniform policy by FEB 2026

We encourage all families to begin planning for the new uniform which is available from Judds Mensland Yarrawonga



UNIFORM GUIDELINES

School uniform is compulsory at Sacred Heart College and all students are expected to take pride in their appearance and grooming. The correct uniform option is to be worn in its entirety to and from the College with no reductions or additional items worn to, from or during the school day. Undergarments must not be visible from uniform items. Full school uniform is to be worn to all excursions and occasions as advised. The Physical Education uniform may be worn to and from school on days when students have Physical Education classes. All items of uniform are required to be in good, well-fitting condition.

Students may wear either the Summer or the Winter uniform at any time throughout the school year however, each uniform must be worn in its entirety. A student may not wear a combination of Summer and Winter at the same time.

Plain navy scarves, gloves and Sacred Heart beanies can be worn to and from school, and outdoors in the colder months. These items are not to be worn indoors during class time.

Dress Length

The College dress and skirt is to be worn within five centimetres of the top of the knee.

Summer Uniform

All students from Years 7-12 may elect to wear one of the following options

OPTION 1

- Navy tailored shorts
- · Short sleeve, light blue button through shirt with embroidered College emblem on pocket
- VCE ONLY: Short sleeve, white button through shirt with embroidered College emblem on pocket

OPTION 2

Brunella College dress

Winter Uniform

All students from Years 7-12 may elect to wear one of the following options

OPTION 1

- Navy pants
- Light blue button through shirt with embroidered College emblem on pocket (available in long or short sleeve)
- VCE ONLY: White button through shirt with embroidered College emblem on pocket (available in long or short sleeve)

OPTION 2

- College winter skirt (mixed check)
- Plain, navy tights
- Light blue button through shirt with embroidered College emblem on pocket (available in long or short sleeve)
- VCE ONLY: White button through shirt with embroidered College emblem on pocket (available in long or short sleeve)

Additional Items

- Plain navy scarf
- Plain navy gloves
- Sacred Heart beanie

Common Elements

- College pullover (wool or cotton option available)
- College soft-shell zip-through jacket (to be worn as outer garment)
- Plain white socks (no logos may be visible)
- Black, leather shoes (no mesh or coloured, visible logos)

Physical Education Uniform

All students from Years 7-12

- Unisex navy sport short
- College sport polo shirt
- Navy microfibre track pants
- Navy, quarter zip fleece with <u>College</u> emblem
- College soft-shell zip-through jacket
- Plain white socks (no logos may be visible)

Sports Shoes

Sports shoes are to be worn with the Physical Education uniform. Shoes must be a runner or crosstrainer style designed to provide support during physical activity.


Wellbeing
